 - 1. **Staddon-Cain Scholarship (Chuck Tierney)**: Awarded this past Sunday \$750 to Emilee Harrell. Will go to Bishop McGinnis for her senior year. She has worked on the Fish Fry and Pancake Breakfast. She works in the community and the Parish, well deserved.
 - 2. **Parish Dash Game (Chuck Tierney):** Dennis did a great job. Got us great seats. Reached out to the Dash and he hooked us up with free food and drinks. Thanks Dennis and Zack from the Dash!
 - 3. **Dash Concessions (Chuck Tierney):** Going well, 5 games of 10 completed by Council, 7 of 10 completed by Columbiettes, 1 of 3 completed by the Assembly. Received a check for almost \$2,000 for games + tips. I did speak to Zack and he broke out the tips. Will receive in 2 paths, 1) Electronic and 2) Cash jar. So far received \$350 in electronic tips. Everything going well.
 - 4. **Honey Bee Festival (Dennis Machuga):** Saturday, August 19th from 10am 5pm. We will have a booth again with tent. We'll hand out Tootsie Rolls around the park. - 4th Degree Report-Rpt by Br Dennis Machuga
 - Memorial Day Weekend Flag placement and pick up for deceased veterans, police & fire dept., and, first responders at Gardens of Memory Cemetery: 446 flags were put on graves, not including the Holy Cross cemetery & columbarium. 12 participated in flag placement and 8 in flag pick-up.
