Business Meeting: February 19th, 2019

Meeting called to order: 7:03pm - GK Pete Pulice presiding. 21 Members in attendance.

- **Warden's Report** - Completed.
- **Opening Prayer** - Lord's prayer
- **Pledge of Allegiance** - Completed
- **Roll Call of Officers** – All present except – Deputy Grand Knight, 3rd Yr Trustee.
- **Opening Ode** – Completed.

- **Reading of previous meeting minutes.** Motion made to Not read the minutes (Chuck Tierney).
Seconded (Dennis Machuga), no discussion - Motion-**Passed**. (4:20)

- **Chaplin's Report:** - Fr Paul (4:34)
 - There has been an unfortunate incident in our parking lot last Friday. As a parishioner was attending adoration her car was broken into and her purse was stolen. Please don't leave valuables visible in your car, even at Church.

- **Grand Knight's Report:** WGK Pete Pulice (5:20)
 - Thanks to all for your work and willingness to volunteer for our activities.
 - Continue to stay current with the Protecting Gods Children. We need a couple more members to sign up for the Safe Environment program which is good for 3 years.
 - The March 19th Business meeting will be moved to March 26th. The annual Stewardship Mission is bumping us out of the Commons. This will be a combined Council/Assembly meeting starting at 7:00. FN Tony will hold an open meeting so that non-4th Degree members can attend. Should last about 30 minutes. The Council business meeting will then start. **So, No Meeting on March 19th.**
 - March 2nd/3rd Rice Bowls will be distributed at all Masses – BK Al Livelsberger explained what this program was about and passed a sheet around for volunteers to sign up to help at the Masses. This has always been a worthy and successful campaign and runs through all of Lent. There is a website available for more information if you are interested.
 - There will be a Bulletin Insert for Baby Bottles distribution on March 3rd. The bottles will be given out on March 10th and then collected on March 24th. We already have volunteers signed up for this event as follows: 5:30 Mass – Matt Mahler, Al Livelsberger, Pete & Janice Pulice, 8:00am Mass: Dennis Machuga, Dave Kempka, Mark Schmitt. 11:00am Mass: Jim Fowler, Chuck Tierney. Then at the 2pm Mass is Victor Sanchez feel free to join in if you can.
 - Fr Paul mentioned that there will be a Memorial Mass for Aaron Crotts on March 8th @ 10:30am. Fr expects a very small group in attendance and asked that if we could attend that would be welcomed. Arron will be buried at the veteran's cemetery in Salisbury.
 - **Recruitment** – BK Jim Fowler reporting – We will be doing something a little different this year. Instead of just passing out brochures after Mass we will be offering a free Fish Fry dinner for anyone that sits with us to discuss becoming a Knight. There will be bulletin announcements starting on the weekend of the 3rd regarding this free dinner and running all through Lent. Let's see how this works for us.



- Parish DASH Game on 6/21/19 – we need a Chairman to run this. (12:13)
- April 26 & 27 is the State Convention in Raleigh. We need Delegates to attend. – a sheet was passed around for volunteers to sign up.
- Nominations for next year's officers, we are looking for New Grand Knight and Deputy Grand Knight and any other officer position as well. Please contact any of the three trustees with either nominations or submit your own name for a position. The plan is to have a slate of officers for the March meeting, send out an email in April as the second reading and then vote in May.
- Pancake Breakfast - Brother Patrick gave a detailed report: We sold 75 meals and collected \$370.00 in revenue. This was the second breakfast in a row that was a record. WGK reported that he had invited the KPD to eat a breakfast on us for National Police Appreciation day. They showed up but did not actually eat. We will do the same for local firefighters for the National Firefighters appreciation day on May 4th.
- Spiritual Reflection – Was held on Saturday January 26th at Salesian Hall. It was an excellent event. Father Jeffry was most engaging and kept us captive. An excellent speaker. It was a very revealing and uplifting event.
- The Columbiettes – Every year we sponsor a Full-page ad in their convention program – a color Ad is \$85 and a b/w Ad is \$75 we need to vote on this under “New Business”.
- One last item: Catholic Charities Mission – March 7th in Winston Salem. A sign-up sheet will be passed around to sign up to attend. The event is free, but a donation is expected.
- The membership director (BK Jim Fowler) mentioned that as part of the recruitment weekend a video produced by the State Council that explains what the Knights are all about will be played prior to all Masses during the weekend of the 10th. (Thanks Fr Paul)

- **Report of the Columbiettes:** BK Dennis Muelker Reporting:

BK Dennis reported that the Columbiettes discussed the DASH games at their meeting and given that we will only be doing the "Carolina Plan" this year, what is the possibility of doing 16 games instead of the 12 that they worked last year. They are concerned about the report times and the traffic issues with the construction in the area.

BK Chuck Tierney volunteered more up to date and relevant information regarding the working conditions and requirements for the "Carolina Plan" games. He offered that these games should be a pretty easy job but is open to the elements. It is outside. The DASH are asking for 8 people to staff the concession but BK Chuck added that these 8 could be broken into two teams of 4 and all 8 would not be required all evening and that on non-busy nights we would only need 3 or 4 people. We would need to be there @5:30 and would only have to stay for 2.5 hours after the start of the game. Usually around 8:30 pm. There would be very little prep work and no clean up after the closing. In his opinion a good deal for \$150.00 per game. Discussion continued among the members present and BK Chuck mentioned that they would try to front load the schedule to get our games in before it got too hot. BK Chuck will correspond with the DASH management to gather even more information.

Second item was that the Columbiettes are asking for us to help with refreshments for the Parish Mission on March 20th. We have supported this the last two years. We would authorized \$100



to \$150 and volunteer to help with the food (light desert and drinks). Dennis will let the Columbiettes know this and report back if needed.

Finally, the Columbiettes would also like us to provide a honor guard for a memorial on March 8th for Aaron. WGK referred Dennis to FN Tony for this item.
